Demonstrating curiosity will make you look good in interviews.

Developing Your Own Interview Questions

Rule Number One when interviewing is to demonstrate enthusiasm. As you formulate questions of your own, focus on the following:

- The **company** looking to hire you
- The **products** or **services** the company features
- The **customers** who buy these products or services

As you do, ask yourself how these things interest and relate to you. And when it comes time to ask these questions, do so with curiosity and enthusiasm.

Examples:

I love both dogs and cats. Would you say you cater to more cat lovers at this location, dog lovers, or is it about equal?

I see on your website you host knitting classes here at Needles & Co. Have you ever thought about offering Saturday classes targeted to high schoolers? I myself would love to teach one.

Interview Questions

- 1. Do you often hire for entry-level positions, or is this a rare opportunity?
- 2. Do young people like working here?
- 3. What kind of training do you offer new employees?
- 4. How do most young employees advance here, as they gain experience and skills?
- 5. What concerns do you have as an employer when hiring young people, and how might I address them?
